1. INTRODUCTION

Historically the river Tay was an active location for rowing, particularly in the professional era of the 19th and early 20th centuries. However over the last 50 years or so there has been limited rowing in this region. Dundee and more recently St Andrews Universities have established Boat Clubs on the Tay close to the city of Perth. The new community based Tay Rowing Club seeks to develop the water of the River Tay as a venue for participation in rowing at all levels. The club will develop an environment and an infrastructure to maximise the potential for rowing in the Tayside region. The club will do this through membership recruitment and by raising funds for a boathouse, new equipment, and supportive environment. It will develop active partners to support the achievement of our objectives, develop programmes and pathways for our young people who express the desire to row and to develop coaches and volunteers to maintain the high standards of governance in the club.

This plan will provide the overall framework to guide the clubs development over the next five years to ensure we contribute to the sustainable development of rowing in the region and in Scotland. It will be subject to annual review in order that changing circumstances and unforeseen developments can be accommodated. The key to the overall success of this plan is the in-built flexibility that the annual review process will provide.

This document is a working tool that will guide the work of the Club over the next 5 years. We are looking forward to working together not only with our governing body but all our partners to ensure sustainable development will put us in a strong position to benefit from the Rio Olympics in 2016 and Tokyo 2020 and sustain our sport well into the future.

2. THE VISION,

The Vision for Tay Rowing Club is

"To provide the opportunity for the people of Tayside and beyond to experience rowing, to reach their potential in rowing and to develop and grow the sport on the Tay to the benefit of people in the local community."

3. VALUES AND PRINCIPLES

4. BACKGROUND

Tay Rowing Club will be affiliated to Scottish Rowing and supports its principles and objectives of promoting rowing across Scotland, offering new opportunities for the sport of rowing and developing athletes to compete at Scottish and British levels. The purpose of developing this strategic plan is to identify and prioritise the key objectives for the club, identify partners who we need to work with and who can help us realise our objectives.

- Create boat club premises to include a boathouse, changing rooms, on land training space and catering facilities
- prioritise acquisition of boats and equipment to support our ambitions for our young people to enjoy participation and to compete at the highest level possible
- provide the correct equipment and boats for those who are learning to row or who require specialist or adaptive equipment

5. ACTION PLANNING

In order to further our strategic objectives we will pursue an action plan setting out the key objectives above, required actions, lead responsibility, identification of resources required and timescales. Timescales will be set in year cycles and allows for discussion with key partners and stakeholders to maximise their contribution.

6. REVIEW

This is a 5 year plan and progress in achieving the objectives will be a standing item at Committee meetings which are scheduled monthly. Additionally, an annual review of objectives will be undertaken at which time any variations to the plan will be discussed with members. Prior to the end of the plan a review of all objectives will be undertaken in order to allow a new plan to be put in place succeeding years.
